

OUR SCHOOL

The International School of Bologna (ISB) is an independent co-educational, International Baccalaureate (IB) continuum school offering a high-quality Early Years to Grade 12 international education to day students residing in the Italian Emilia-Romagna region. Since its inception in 2004, ISB has been committed to high quality learning through a holistic and balanced inquirybased university preparation educational program delivered in the English language medium. ISB is situated in the historical center of Bologna. The current school population is 275 students with around 55% expatriate families and 45% local families with one or both parents being Italian. ISB is strongly defined by the rich local culture. Bologna is home to the oldest university in the Western World and ISB takes pride in using its unique location as an educational resource, making authentic real-life connections for students at all grade levels and in all subject groups, and exposing students to conceptually connected learning experiences that make Bologna our extended classroom.

ACADEMIC PROGRAMME

ISB provides a challenging college preparatory high school curriculum. All courses taught at ISB are based on the International Baccalaureate (IB) curriculum framework. Taking into consideration the host country context and our international student body, the IB curriculum offered at ISB has its own unique character, influenced by the particular context of Bologna which itself has a rich cultural and educational heritage. ISB students engage in a well-rounded educational journey through the successful completion of the IB Middle Years Programme (MYP) in grades 9-10 and the rigorous IB Diploma courses in grades 11-12. ISB students can choose to pursue graduation with the full International Baccalaureate Diploma (IBDP) or our NEASC accredited ISB High School Diploma.

INTERNATIONAL BACCALAUREATE DIPLOMA PROGRAMME (IBDP)

The IBDP is a two-year programme of study for students aged 16-19, and is globally recognized by universities for the holistic and rigorous education it provides. In addition to the 3 higher level and 3 standard level subjects, IB Diploma candidates are required to complete the following three core components of the programme: Theory of Knowledge (TOK), Extended Essay (EE), and Creativity, Activity and Service (CAS). In order to be awarded the IB Diploma, all assessment components for each of the six subjects and the core requirements must be completed.

ACCREDITATION

ISB is accredited by the New England Association of Schools and Colleges (NEASC), and by the Council of International Schools (CIS). ISB is also fully authorized by the International Baccalaureate Organization (IBO) as an IB World School offering three IB programmes, PYP, MYP and the DP. Furthermore, ISB is proud to be the first Google Reference School in Italy, a founding member of the regional IB Association in Italy (AIBWSI) and a member of the Educational Collaborative for International Schools (ECIS).

ISB HIGH SCHOOL DIPLOMA REQUIREMENTS

To be able to obtain the ISB High School Diploma, students are required to gain a total of 23 credits from grades 9 to 12 (in accordance with the below chart). This includes taking a minimum of 5 courses in the final two years of high school, as well as satisfying the learning outcomes for CAS. A yearlong course is worth 1 credit.
